## [FC & BC 3: Description of Ground]

### Introduction

1. A quick, accurate and standard procedure is necessary to enable a commander to describe an area to his men and the men to understand it correctly.

### Types of Ground

(a) Broken Ground. It is uneven and is generally interspersed with nullahs, bums and fields in the ground. It is suitable for move of infantry and

hinders observation of activities.

(b) Flat and Open Ground. It is even ground with little cover. It is not suitable for move of infantry by day.

(c) High Ground. Ground far above the general level of the area e.g. hill. It facilitates domination of area around it by observation or fire or both.

(d) Dead Ground. Ground that is hidden from an observer's view. It cannot be covered by flat trajectory weapons.
